

WHEELCHAIR Resources

Your child's wheelchair should have a sticker on the bottom rail (near the wheels) with your vendor's company name and phone number. That's where you should first call for any repairs or wheelchair issues.

If you can't reach them or if you are looking to purchase a new wheelchair (note: current Medicaid guidelines dictate that wheelchairs can not be replaced if they are less than 5 years old; if a w/c is less than 5 years old you must look to have it repaired), here is a list of vendors and clinics below. You will typically need to make an appointment and have a physician's prescription stating 'WheelChair repair as needed'.
